

ILRS Virtual World Tour 2020: First Circular November 2-6, 2020

In place of an ILRS Workshop this November, the ILRS wanted to take the opportunity to try something different and to look in detail at a selection of stations in the global network.

Therefore, we are planning an online 'Virtual World Tour', to be held November 2-6, 2020, to virtually visit 5 stations in 5 days, stopping at:

- Graz, Austria
- Greenbelt MD, USA
- Simosato, Japan
- Yarragadee, Australia
- Zimmerwald, Switzerland

Each two-hour session will consist of an introductory presentation about the station followed by a tour of the site highlighting instrumentation, software, safety, automation, operations, as well as current issues and future plans. We hope to include a mixture of pre-recorded and live presentations in these sessions. There will also be opportunities for questions.
